Detailed Instructor's Notes

A. Introduction

1. We are going to play a Kahoot game, but first, let's review key information about strategies, laws and information related to safer and healthier workplaces. Look over the *Are You A Working Teen?* Factsheet. The main topics covered are:
 - Page 1 —Hazards to watch out for
 - Page 2 —Your rights on the job and how to protect yourself
 - Page 3 — What kinds of work can you do if you are under 18 and how long or late can you work
 - Page 4 — What if you get hurt on the job? & Where to go for help if you a safety problem
2. *Allow participants a few minutes to look at the Factsheet.*
3. *Players go to kahoot.it and enter the Game PIN, then enter their nickname.*
4. *Click "Start" once you can see all the players' nicknames on the "lobby" or waiting screen. During gameplay you can use the space bar or your mouse to go to the next question.*
